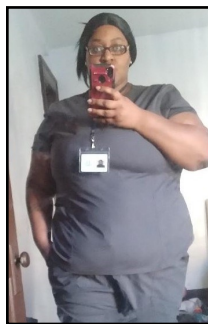

Rattle Noisemaker

Invite children to make these simple noisemakers for cheering on their favorite sports teams.



1. Place a handful of dried beans, rice, clean fish tank gravel, shiny pennies, or colorful beads inside a clean empty plastic bottle.
2. For safety, glue the lid onto the bottle so that it cannot be removed.
3. Decorate with stripes of colored tape or stickers.

Easy Animal Crackers Recipe

Ingredients

1 cup whole-wheat flour 2 tbs milk
1/2 tsp baking powder 2 tbs maple syrup
1/8 teaspoon salt 1/2 tsp vanilla

1/4 cup butter, softened

*Preheat the oven-375°F. Line two baking sheets with parchment paper.

Place all ingredients into a bowl and use your hand to mix together to form a dough. (If the dough is a little crumbly, add 1 tbs additional milk.) Flatten dough.

Roll the dough 1/4 inch thick between two pieces of lightly floured pieces of parchment paper. The flour will ensure that the cuts are easy to move. Cut out the dough with a cookie cutter and place on baking sheets. Bake 7-9 min., until lightly brown. Remove from the oven, let cool on the baking sheet for a minute, and transfer to a wire rack to cool completely.

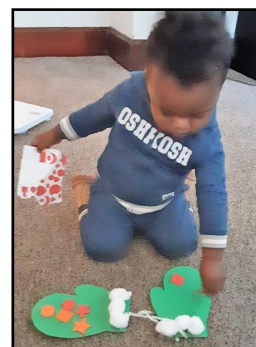
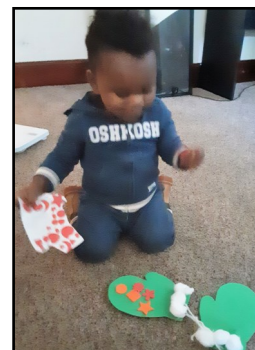

string them together.

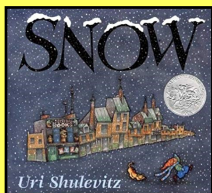

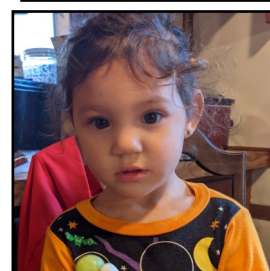

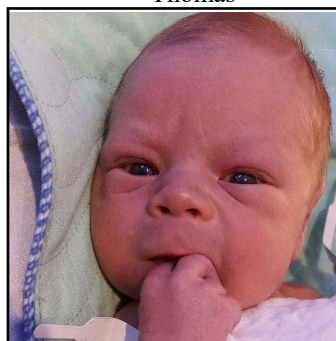
